Summer 2023 – Spring 2024 Curriculum

The requirements below are effective beginning Summer 2023. Students are advised to reach out to their academic advisor to determine which curriculum they are subject to.

To be admitted to the Hospitality and Tourism Management major, students must (1) have completed at least 52 semester hours, (2) have completed HFT 1000, CGS 2100 or CGS 2518, ECO 2013 or ECO 2023, and MAC 1105 with a grade of “C-” or better in each course, (3) have a cumulative FSU GPA of at least 2.0 on all college work attempted, and (4) successful completion of 1st and 2nd GE English and Math coursework. **While some courses may be offered online, this major is an in-person only program and requires students to attend the main campus.**

Lower-level Prerequisites: All courses must be completed with a “C-” or better prior to admission to the major.

Additional Information:

1. Hospitality and Tourism Management majors must complete 1,000 hours of work experience in the hospitality industry at the post- secondary level. Students must report hours to the Kimberly Handt (khandt@dedman.fsu.edu) to receive credit for their work hours.
2. **Students are required to complete an Internship(s) for academic credit (HFT 3941) through the Dedman College as part of their work experience. At least 3 credit hours must be earned to fulfill the academic internship requirement.** The hours worked during the Internship(s) will also count toward the required 1,000 hours of work experience. 3. HFT 1000 is not required, but highly recommend, for transfer students prior to admission.
4. **In addition to the requirements outlined above, each student must complete all University-wide requirements for graduation.** These requirements include liberal studies requirements, the summer school requirement, the FSU residency requirement, and total hours requirements.
5. Students needing elective hours to satisfy the University 120 total hours requirement are encouraged to take additional courses from the list of hospitality electives that are taught in the Dedman College beyond the semester hours required.
6. Not all hospitality management courses are taught every semester. It is crucial that students work with their Dedman College academic advisor to plan their future course schedules to ensure timely degree completion.
7. The Dedman College offers a number of international opportunities for students to include study abroad, global exchanges, and international internships. Students can learn more at: <https://dedman.fsu.edu/current-students/international-opportunities>.
8. Students must not enroll in any course at another institution without first receiving approval from the Dedman College of Hospitality. Once enrolled at FSU, students should plan to take their Hospitality courses at FSU. Any exception to this policy must be approved in advance by the Dedman College. Transfer of upper-level Hospitality courses completed prior to enrolling at FSU must be from other 4-year, accredited institutions. These courses must be approved for course substitution by the Dedman College upon entering FSU.
